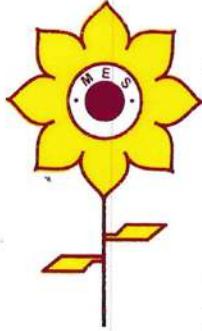
6. Rights and obligations of each partner:

- vii. All **personnel** recruited for the project or who receive any remuneration for the project will be Citizens of India or Individuals authorized to work in India.

- viii. All payments and invoices for the UXO will be made in Indian Rupees utilizing the exchange rate prevailing on the date of purchase.
- ix. The remuneration for all the trainers will be done directly by the NYU-Stern-UP.
- x. Any additional Terms and Conditions subsequent to the signing of this MOU can be added as an annexure after the mutual consent of both parties.

7. USAGE OF MES/NYU-STERN-UP LOGO :

Usage of either parties Logo shall be with the prior approval of SPOCs.

8. CONJUNCTION:

This Memorandum of Agreement shall be in conjunction with Non Disclosure Agreement signed between both the parties effective on the Start Date and both parties shall abide by the terms and conditions laid down in the said Agreement.

11. LEGAL JURISDICTION:

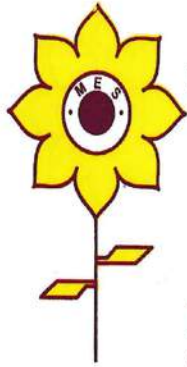

Personnel Requirements for the UXO between Start Date and End Date.

All Personnel will be on the MES payroll as consultants.

UXO Coordinator:

Pritika Hingorani shall be appointed as Adjunct Professor with MES to act as Coordinator of the UXO. The UXO Coordinator shall make all personnel decisions with regards to recruitment, training, leave and holiday policies, work hours and termination of all UXO personnel. Pritika Hingorani is a full-time employee of the IDFC Institute, a division of IDFC Limited. Her responsibilities as Coordinator form a part of her existing responsibilities as Team Coordinator for the IDFC-NYU Urban Expansion Initiative, a project governed by an MoU between the IDFC Institute and NYU Stern.

Gross monthly salary to be paid to IDFC Institute: \$1000 (USD)

Supervisors:

Two Indian UXO Supervisors will be selected by the Indian UXO Coordinator and a representative from the Urbanization Project and will be hired as employees of the Indian partner organization. These Supervisors will be responsible for managing day-to-day operation of the Observatory. They will also be responsible for assigning cities to analysts, verifying the accuracy of the completed polygons for each locale, checking land use assignments for accuracy, operating the python script, and calculating variance for each expansion area (with the last two steps to be verified by Urbanization Project personnel). They will be in regular contact with the Urbanization Project personnel for updates and guidance. Ideally, one of the Supervisors will be qualified in computer science or a related field, and the other will have a background in Urban Studies, Urban Planning, Quantitative Geography, or Architecture.

Gross Monthly Salary to be paid: \$800 (USD)

Image Analysts:

Twelve Indian UXO Image Analysts will be hired as full-time consultants, all with an education in computer science, urban planning, or a related field. Recent graduates would be ideal, as this is an entry-level position. By way of a performance incentive, they will also be entered into a contest to win an all-expenses-paid trip to the Habitat III conference in 2016. These analysts will undertake the hands-on digitization of the polygons at the Indian Urban Expansion Observatory. They will undergo one week of training, in which they will learn to identify land uses and to draw polygons on the satellite imagery using Java Open Street Map.

Gross Monthly Salary to be paid: \$500 (USD)

Incentive Pay:

A bonus pool will be created for both the supervisors and the analysts. The system for awarding bonuses will be determined in a mutually agreeable manner before salary payments commence. It will include a formula for dividing the bonuses between the supervisors and the analysts. The bonus pool will be replenished quarterly, and the total amounts involved are as follows:

14 A party may suspend or terminate this Agreement if the other party enters into an arrangement or composition with or for the benefit of its creditors, goes into administration, receivership or administrative receivership, is declared bankrupt or insolvent or is dissolved or otherwise ceases to carry on business or any analogous event happens to the other party in any jurisdiction in which it is incorporated or resident or in which it carries on business or has assets.

15 APPLICABLE LAWS & ANTI-BRIBERY

16 University represents and warrants that it will comply with all applicable laws and regulations, including all applicable commercial and public anti-bribery laws ("**Anti-Bribery Laws**") such as the U.S. Foreign Corrupt Practices Act of 1977 and the UK Bribery Act of 2010, which prohibit corrupt offers of anything of value, either directly or indirectly, to a government official to obtain or keep business or to secure any other improper commercial advantage. "Government officials" include any government employee; candidate for public office; and employee of government-owned or government-controlled companies, public international organizations, and political parties.

17 University and its personnel have not and will not offer, pay, promise or authorise the payment, directly or through any other person or entity, of anything of value for the purpose of inducing or rewarding any favourable action or influencing any act or decision in connection with Google's business to a candidate for public office or to an official or employee of a government, government-controlled entity, public international organisation or political party.

18 Both parties acknowledge that Google, by entering into and performing its obligations under this agreement, is in no way seeking an improper benefit from the University or from any other party.



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19 Nothing in this Agreement will prevent University or its students or staff from obtaining services equivalent to or the same as those provided by Google under this Agreement from a third party.

20 CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION AND DATA PROTECTION

21 "**Confidential Information**" means information disclosed by one party to the other party under this Agreement that is marked as confidential or, from its nature, content or the circumstances in which it is disclosed, ought reasonably to be supposed to be confidential. It does not include information that the recipient already knew, that becomes public through no fault of the recipient, that was independently developed by the recipient or that was lawfully given to the recipient by a third party. The recipient of any Confidential Information will not disclose that Confidential Information, except to group companies, employees and/or professional advisors who need to know it and who have agreed in writing (or in the case of professional advisors are otherwise bound) to keep it confidential. The recipient will ensure that those people and entities: (a) use such Confidential Information only to exercise rights and fulfil obligations under this Agreement, and (b) keep such Confidential Information confidential. The recipient may also disclose Confidential Information when required by law after giving reasonable notice to the discloser, such notice to be sufficient to give the discloser the opportunity to seek confidential treatment, a protective order or similar remedies or relief prior to disclosure. Upon Google's written request, University will promptly return all Confidential Information and copies, or certify in writing that it has destroyed all such materials.

22 NO PUBLICITY

23 University will not issue any public statements or promotional materials disclosing the existence of this Agreement or its terms without Google's prior written consent.

24 With Google's prior written consent, University will be entitled to disclose the existence and nature of this Agreement, but not its terms, to suppliers of Infrastructure to University.

25 WARRANTIES & INDEMNITY

26 University warrants that:

- (a) as of the Effective Date, the number of enrolled University students is at least the number set out at the beginning of this Agreement;
- (b) all information provided by or on behalf of University in connection with this Agreement is true, complete and accurate; and
- (c) it is not subject to any contractual or other restriction imposed by its own or any other organisation's rules or regulations or otherwise which may conflict or prevent its compliance with this Agreement.

27 As between the parties, no conditions, warranties or other terms (including any implied terms as to satisfactory quality, fitness for purpose or conformance with description) apply to any Infrastructure purchased by or for University under this Agreement. Subject to Clause 30, Google shall have no liability to University arising out of the purchase or use by University of any Infrastructure.

28 University shall indemnify Google against all liabilities arising out of any claim against Google in relation to the purchase or use of Infrastructure by University



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29 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

30 Nothing in this Agreement will exclude or limit either party's liability for:

31 death or personal injury resulting from its negligence or the negligence of its employees or agents;

32 fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation;

33 breach of any implied condition as to title or quiet enjoyment;

34 the indemnity in Clause 28;

35 misuse of Confidential Information; or

36 payment of sums properly due and owing to the other in the course of normal performance of this Agreement.

37 Subject to Clause 30, neither party shall have any liability to the other (whether in contract, tort or otherwise) for any special, indirect or consequential losses (whether or not such losses were within the contemplation of the parties at the date of this Agreement) suffered or incurred by the other party.

38 Subject to Clauses 30 and 37, each party's total aggregate liability under this Agreement (whether in contract, tort or otherwise) shall be limited to the greater of:

(a) 50,000 USD; and

(b) the amount paid or payable by Google to University pursuant to Clause 8.

39 GENERAL

40 Notices. All notices of termination or breach must be in writing and addressed to the other party's Legal Department. The email address for notices being sent to Google's Legal Department is legal-notices@google.com. All other notices must be in English, in writing and addressed to the other party's primary contact. Notice will be treated as given on receipt, as verified by written or automated receipt or by electronic log (as applicable).

41 Assignment. Neither party may assign any part of this Agreement without the written consent of the other, except to an affiliate where: (a) the assignee has agreed in writing to be bound by the terms of this Agreement; (b) the assigning party remains liable for obligations under the Agreement if the assignee defaults on them; and (c) the assigning party has notified the other party of the assignment. Any other attempt to assign is void.

42 Change of Control. If a party experiences a change of control (for example, through a stock purchase or sale, merger, or other form of corporate transaction): (a) that party will give written notice to the other party within 30 days after the change of control, and (b) the other party may immediately terminate this Agreement any time between the change of control and 30 days after it receives that written notice.

43 Subcontracting. Either party may subcontract any of its obligations under this Agreement, without the written consent of the other. The subcontracting party will remain liable for all subcontracted obligations and all acts or omissions of its subcontractors.



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44Force Majeure. Neither party will be liable for failure or delay in performance to the extent caused by circumstances beyond its reasonable control.

45No Waiver. Neither party will be treated as having waived any rights by not exercising (or delaying the exercise of) any rights under this Agreement.

46No Agency. This Agreement does not create any agency, partnership or joint venture between the parties.

47No Third Party Beneficiaries. This Agreement does not confer any benefits on any third party unless it expressly states that it does.

48Counterparts. The parties may execute this Agreement in counterparts, including facsimile, PDF, and other electronic copies, which taken together will constitute one instrument.

49Amendments. Any amendment must be in writing, signed by both parties, and expressly state that it is amending this Agreement.

50Entire Agreement. Subject to clause 32, this Agreement supersedes all other agreements between the parties relating to its subject matter.

51Severability. If any term (or part of a term) of this Agreement is invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the rest of the Agreement will remain in effect.

52Governing Law. This Agreement and any dispute (contractual or non-contractual) concerning it or its subject matter or formation (a "**Dispute**") is governed by English law. Any Dispute shall be referred to and finally resolved by arbitration under the rules of the LCIA, which rules are deemed to be incorporated by reference into this clause. The number of arbitrators shall be three. The seat, or legal place, of arbitration shall be London, England. The language to be used in the arbitration shall be English. This clause shall be without prejudice to the right of either party to apply to any court of competent jurisdiction for emergency, interim or injunctive relief (together "**Interim Relief**").


