## **International Yoga day**

As part of worldwide observation of International Yoga Day, National Service Scheme of Pillai College of Arts, Commerce & Science, New Panvel in association with Patanjali Yoga Samiti, Mumbai also observed this day on 21st June, 2016 in the campus. A yoga training session from 8:30am to 10:30 am was organized in which Principal Dr.Daphne Pillai, students, teaching and non-teaching staff took part enthusiastically and practiced various 'asanas' of Yoga and pranayama. A Yoga practitioner was invited to demonstrate various Yoga postures and asanas. It was a healthy session and everybody celebrated the day with much fervour.

## **Essay Writing Competition on Tree Plantation**

To sensitize students towards the importance of Environment and Nature the N.S.S. Unit of Pillai College of Arts, Commerce & Science organized an Essay Writing Competition on Tree Plantation on 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2016. The event witnessed a gratifying response from the students.

## **Tree Plantation Drive**

NSS Unit of Pillai College of Arts, Commerce & Science participated in the Mega Saplings Plantation Drive at Village Koshimbe, Bhiwandi, Thane on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2016. This was arranged with an agreement to help the government implement the initiative to reverse the decline of green cover of the state and enhance biodiversity by planting 25 lakh saplings on a single day. The Students enthusiastically supported the cause. Taking part in this massive plantation drive highlights the Institutions commitment to the environment.

#### **Disaster Management**

To make endeavours towards creating awareness among the students about disasters and its consequences and to prepare them in advance to face such situations the N.S.S Unit held disaster management training on 5<sup>th</sup> July, 2016. This session was conducted by Disaster Management Authority, Alibag, Raigad. 74 students participated and were benefitted.

#### **Poster Exhibition on Tree Plantation**

The N.S.S Unit conducted a Poster Exhibition on Tree Plantation on 17<sup>th</sup> July 2016. The objective of this exercise was to increase awareness among the students about the importance of trees and to create a sense of responsibility among them to nurture and look after the trees and actively participate in combating pollution.

### **Rehabilitation and Treatment Campaign**

The NSS cell took the initiative to educate students by organizing Leprosy Education, Rehabilitation and Treatment Campaign by an NGO, ALERT - INDIA on 27th July 2016 which enlightened almost 500 students. The prime focus of this program was to focus on the causes of leprosy, signs and symptoms and how to overcome it by simple and effective treatment. Donor cards were issued by Alert India and the college holds an incredible record

in the academic year 2015-2016 by collecting 62,182 INR and donating it to ALERT - INDIA.

## **Cosmetology Treatment Camp**

The National Service Scheme and Jyovi's Care Pvt Ltd jointly organized free Cosmetology Treatment Camp on 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2016 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. The students were exposed to the latest techniques in cosmetic treatment of the hair, skin, and nails. Around 200 students along with supporting and teaching staff were examined and benefitted.

## **Awareness Talk on Monsoon Induced Diseases**

No doubt the monsoon is a welcome relief after a dry spell for some time. However, the rain also welcomes a multitude of health problems. Prevention is always better than cure. Accordingly, The Lions Club of Navi Mumbai Champions, the N.S.S. Unit of Pillai College of Arts, Commerce & Science and Fortis Hiranandani Hospital, Vashi jointly organized an Awareness and Educational Programme on Monsoon Induced Diseases for the students on 4<sup>th</sup> August 2016. The ultimate objective of the programme was to prevent getting infected from Monsoon Related Diseases. Overall the programme was successful and the response was good. The efforts put in by the N.S.S. Unit proved to be a great success.

# **Enrolment Camp for Electoral Roll**

The N.S.S. Unit organized a two day drive on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> August, 2016 in the college premises. The objective of this programme is to enrol the students who had crossed 18 years of age in the Electoral Roll. In this special drive, the eligible students were required to enrol themselves in the electoral roll by filling Declaration Form (supplied by Election Commission of India). Students who had already enrolled were required to submit a declaration to that extent. Students from diverse disciplines had participated in this special drive, and many students had newly enrolled their names as voters and other students had signed in the declaration form stating that they were already enrolled.

# Blood Donation Camp – Another milestone for the N.S.S.Unit

National Service Scheme of Pillai College of Arts, Commerce and Science in association with St. George Hospital, Nair Hospital, J.J.Mahanagar Blood Bank and Wadia Hospital organized a Blood donation camp in the college premises on 12<sup>th</sup> August, 2016. It began at around 10 a.m. and continued up to 3:30 p.m., with a steady stream of donors throughout. A blood bank team comprising doctors, nurses, and technicians helped the unit to organize the camp. Principal, staff and students displayed full commitment and involvement in the cause and turned up in large numbers to donate blood. The venue was filled with young Pillaities chatting with each other, happy to be able to play their part in lending a helping hand to people in the region. NSS volunteers played a key role in spreading awareness about the event to the students. The donors were given refreshments and they also received certificate of recognition.

At the end of the day over 576 bottles of blood were collected at the blood donation camp setting a new record on the quantity of blood collected at a single camp. Out of these collected samples 145 blood bottles were given to St. George Hospital, 141 to Nair Hospital, 158 to J.J.Mahanagar Blood Bank and 132 to Wadia Hospital respectively.

Throughout the day, there were smiles and laughter all around - a true embodiment of what we believe in - selfless service with a smile.

## Thalassemia awareness and detection program in the campus:

Thalassemia is a group of genetic disorder of blood. It is caused by defective formation of Haemoglobin. Two common types are: Thalassemia Major and Thalassemia Minor (Carrier). Thalassemia Major Disease is preventable. Carriers are generally healthy with mild anemia. With a view to create awareness amongst the students, faculty and staff members, the NSS unit of Pillai College of Arts, Commerce and Science in association with International Association of the Lions Clubs had organized a "Thalassemia Awareness and Detection Camp" on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2016 in the campus.

The day started off with awareness campaign. Ms. Usha Talwar conducted awareness through intensive class room contact program. Following the campaign the detection camp witnessed a spontaneous participation from NSS volunteers, students, teachers, non-teaching staffs for screening.131 blood samples were collected. The camp was well executed with the able support of Prof. Shabab Rizvi and the excellent co-ordination and teamwork between staff members, lab technicians and all the volunteers of the event. This camp ended with smile on the faces of the organizers, who were happy to create awareness about Thalassemia in the college.

## **Organ Donation Camp**

The N.S.S. Unit in association with Wheels Charitable Trust organized an Organ Donation Camp on 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2016. The students and the volunteers enthusiastically supported with true embodiment of what we believe in selfless service with a smile and took initiative and participated in this social cause.

The N.S.S. Unit initiated Swach Bharat Abhiyan on National Service Scheme Foundation Day which was held on 24<sup>th</sup> September, 2016. #### **`Women's Bike Rally' spotlights two-wheeler safety issues**

On 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2017, N.S.S. Unit in association with Navi Mumbai Traffic and Fortis Hospital, Vashi, flagged off 'Women's Bike Rally' for the 'Road Safety Campaign'. Over 250 women bikers participated in the bike rally to educate the public on the importance of wearing helmets while riding two-wheelers. The initiative has been taken to spread awareness about the importance of road safety by the Navi Mumbai Traffic Police partnered by Fortis Hospital, Vashi. The biker cavalcade, on its journey from Centre One mall, Vashi to Centre One mall, Nerul, engaged with motorists and pedestrians about the importance of road safety and the fatalities that could be avoided.

### World's Largest Walk Against Blindness

The N.S.S. unit took part in the 'Tamaso Ma Jyotir Gamaya – The Walk Against Blindness' organized on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2017 which the Advanced Eye Hospital and Institute (AEHI) and One Vision Health and Research Foundation claim it as the largest-ever walk in the country to raise awareness for the pledging of eye donations. Nearly 7,000 people across age groups and professions pledged to donate their eyes during event on Palm Beach Road in Sanpada, Navi Mumbai.

This year, the walk was preceded by a carnival in the top eight colleges of the city, with students participating in singing, dancing and video-making contests. The audition for the same was organized in our college campus on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2016 and the semi-finals were conducted on 4<sup>th</sup> January 2017. 5 students were shortlisted for the finals. We are proud to announce that in the final round **Zubair S.Y.B.M.M.** bagged the Best Movie Making award for which he was felicitated with a trophy, cash prize and certificate and Immanual T.Y.B.FM won the second prize in dance and was awarded with a trophy and certificate.

#### **Road Safety Week**

The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways has organized the 28<sup>th</sup> Road Safety Week from 9<sup>th</sup> January, 2016 to 15<sup>th</sup> January, 2016 throughout the country to create awareness among the general public to improve the safety on road. In association with the Ministry, the N.S.S. unit conducted a week long activities to contribute to the cause of road safety. The activities included display of banners, lecture on road safety, poster exhibition, essay writing competition on road safety, Short film on road safety and a street play was also enacted for the same.

### **Heartfulness Meditation Session**
