Agenda II

To plan for new courses in the Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship.

Dr. Kavita Kathare reported to the Chair that around 300 students have enrolled for Certificate courses in the First Term conducted by College and Coursera Courses, which is a

collaborative initiative of MES. Courses like GST, Tally ERP, Financial Planning, Commercial Banking, Clinical Data Management, Global Environment Management, Data Science, Digital Marketing, Diploma in Hospital Services Management (in association with T.I.S.S.), Diploma in Banking & Financial Services Management (in association with T.I.S.S.), Soft skills, Derivative markets etc. were conducted in the First Term. She added that for the Second Term T.I.S.S. courses for second year students will be started. Along with that, Advanced Excel Course, at a very reasonable rate, will be offered to students, placement training programs will be continued. Equity Derivatives Course will also be introduced.
