New Age Skilling

The chair announced the introduction of New Age Programmes and Courses for the current academic year to address the evolving needs of the job market and modern industries. The chair highlighted the launch of innovative degree programs including:

The chair further shared that the Department of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship has introduced new age courses, incentivized by skill credits. These initiatives aim to equip students with cutting-edge skills and knowledge, ensuring they are well-prepared for future career opportunities.

Agenda IV

Comprehensive implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP).

The Chair announced that this year, the institution has implemented the National Education Policy (NEP) in a more comprehensive manner. Under this agenda, the Chair highlighted the institution's efforts to integrate the NEP 2020 guidelines, emphasizing the following key initiatives:

Pioneering Initiatives in NEP:

- Introduction of Major-Minor courses.
- Dual Degree options.
- Multiple Entry and Exit pathways.
- Implementation of Outcome-Based Education.
- Integration of Indian Knowledge Systems.

Focus Areas in Line with NEP 2020:

- Vocational Education: Enhanced focus on vocational training and skill development.
- Technology Integration: Greater incorporation of technology in teaching and learning processes.
- Minor Options Basket: Expanded offerings of minor subjects to complement major courses.
- Honors Option with Apprenticeship: Introduction of an honors program that includes apprenticeship opportunities.
- Research-Focused Fourth Year: A research-intensive fourth year for undergraduate programs.

The Chair emphasized that these initiatives demonstrate the institution's commitment to embracing the principles of NEP 2020, providing students with a comprehensive and futureready educational experience. The members expressed their support and appreciation for these progressive steps, recognizing the positive impact they will have on the institution and its students.

Agenda V

IKS and Generative AI in curriculum.

IQAC Coordinator, Dr. Aarti Sukheja shared that a course on general IKS has been made mandatory for students of all the programmes and domain specific IKS is integrated in core courses to foster a deeper understanding of indigenous wisdom and cultural heritage. Apart from this, IQAC has planned to conduct exhibitions in the said academic year for showcasing rich Indian wisdom, as a part of assessment for these IKS courses. It was further shared that students were offered 3 Indian languages, Sanskrit, Malayalam and Marathi in the AEC (Ability Enhancement Courses) basket and the following new sections would be included the current edition of College Magazine: Hindi, Marathi, Malayalam, and Sanskrit , encouraging students to contribute articles in different languages.

The Chair emphasized the imperative of integrating Generative AI into every program's curriculum starting from the current academic year. To facilitate this integration, a Workshop on How to Use Generative AI Tools will be organized in the said term. This hands-on training opportunity will enable faculty members to explore and navigate various generative AI tools, granting them firsthand experience with the technology. The session will delve into key concepts, practical applications, and provide step-by-step guidance on seamlessly integrating generative AI tools into the teaching curriculum. This initiative aims to bridge the gap between traditional teaching methods and emerging technologies, ensuring our faculty are well-equipped to impart cutting-edge knowledge to our students.

Agenda VI

Extensive Use of Experiential Learning and Business Simulation for teaching.

The chair announced the successful establishment of a Business Simulation Laboratory on campus. It was further shared that the faculty have received comprehensive training to utilize this resource effectively. Emphasizing its importance, the chair highlighted the extensive use of Business Simulation as a teaching tool. The Simulation Laboratory offers students a practical avenue to gain insights into business management and decision-making processes. By assuming roles as business managers or executives, students can make decisions and experience their consequences within a controlled virtual environment. This initiative aims to enhance students'

practical understanding of business concepts and prepare them for real-world challenges in the corporate landscape.

The Chair emphasized the need for extensive use of the institution's comprehensive experiential learning program, Anubhav Manthan, which bridges classroom learning with real-world applications. This initiative incorporates internships, field visits, and projects into every program, ensuring students gain relevant hands-on experience. Key components include internship immersion, hands-on training forums, event management engagement, business simulation labs, and reflective field visits.

Agenda VII

New Research Centres.

The Chair announced the establishment of new Ph.D. Centres in Management and Biotechnology, and the application for a Ph.D. Research Centre in IT.

The Chair announced the setting up of new Ph.D. Centres in Management and Biotechnology. Additionally, it was shared that the college has applied for the establishment of a Ph.D. Research Centre in IT. This initiative aims to offer students the opportunity to pursue Ph.D. studies and benefit from advanced research facilities. The members expressed their support for these developments, recognizing the potential for enhanced academic and research opportunities for students and faculty.

Agenda VIII

Development of Smart Classrooms and increase in the number of computer labs.

The Chair announced the introduction of 2 new computer labs. The decision was made considering new academic offerings, and the need for technology integration. The institution now boasts 7 advanced and well-equipped computer labs with the latest configurations. With the addition of the 2 new labs this year, the total number of computer labs has increased to 9.

The Chair highlighted the increase in the number of Smart Classrooms. This initiative aims to enable teachers to employ modern teaching methods and enhance the overall learning experience.

Agenda IX

Implementation of Smart School MIS.

Mrs. Deepika Sharma, the Vice Principal, announced that the Smart School Management Information System (MIS) has been implemented this year for managing attendance, exams, and other administrative tasks. Dr. Shabab Rizvi and Mrs. Rabiya have been appointed as the incharges for this system. The Chair has instructed IQAC to organize training sessions for the staff, in collaboration with the MIS Team, to ensure smooth execution.

The chair instructed Environment Cell to develop detailed plans for implementing nest boxes and feeding stations, ensuring they align with campus sustainability goals and explore additional opportunities for green initiatives that contribute to campus biodiversity and environmental sustainability.
